## **REPORT**

First league game of the 2017 season and Hemel I established their place in the local 'pecking order' with a 73 run win over Kings Langley. Put into bat by Langley Hemel lost 2 early wickets to ex-Hemel player Mark Brazier but recovered a bit to 90 - 4 with 42 from Lewis Hodgins and 28 from Manvir Chauhan. 90 - 4 after 20 overs Langley must have felt in command. They had not reckoned with Jack Doodson (103\*) and Matt Dale (75\*) who then put on an undefeated 178 for the 5th wicket to see Hemel up to 268 - 4. This score was a record 5th wicket stand for Hemel in League cricket beating the previous 119 from 1998 vs what were then Old Millhillians.

Hemel then had the bowling to lay hold of their winning total. Two 10 over spells from Parth Mehta (1-37) and Nick Hodgins (2-36) took out a large portion of the 50 overs, tight early spells from Duncan Howard (1-20) and Ed Langley (2-45) left the way for Lewis Hodgins to wrap things up with his own 'hattrick, taking the last 3 wickets all caught and bowled as he held onto fiercely driven return balls.
