<u>REPORT</u>

A thrilling 1st round match in the Readers Herts County Trophy which saw Hemel come out on top by 17 runs. Winning the toss and batting first Hemel were looking to build a large defendable score with the knowledge they were one or two attacking bowlers light. This they did with Tom Elborn (87) batting through almost to the end of their 50 overs. Tom Waterton (53) and Sunday skipper Jack doodson (24) kept things moving along. A few 6's from Aaron Wilson and Will Langley at the end brought Hemel up to 282 - 7.

Manipulating the bowling resources was Jack Doodsons task, one or two danger batsmen in the Northchurch line-up.
