REPORT

Last week the then leaders Shenley Village, this week the then 2nd placed Reed, as Hemel continued their march up the table in the Championship.. But a close run thing this time with weather taking it's impact on proceedings. Put in to bat Hemel were soon in trouble at 5 - 2 after 4 overs as both openers were dismissed by Reed opening bowler Jack Tidey. Then Brett Penny, at 3 for Hemel, was dismissed after 10 overs and Hemel were 27 - 3. As ever, as the saying goes 'Cometh the need, cometh the man' and Jack Doodson proved to be that man. He then went on to score 103 from 127 balls with 16 X 4 and 1 X 6 to bring Hemel around. Helped along the way with 24 from Ed Langley even when he was out at 158 - 7 in still needed 26 from last weeks Heath Park Cup MOM Tom Elborn to hit 26 from 24 balls for Hemel to make it to 196 - 8 from their rain allotted 51 overs. Not in 2nd place for no reason Reed were after the chase. 77 - 2 from their first 13 overs as they sped along. The draw of spinner Parth Mehta (16 - 4 52 - 3) proved to be their undoing. He kept them just behind the asking rate on their run chase and Hemel had sufficient bowling changes to keep them thinking. Wickets spread around until Lewis Hodgins, who had opened the bowling, could come back on and pick up 2 wickets at the end including Matt Sampson (42) who had held Reed together towards a narrow win, for them, until he was taken at mid wicket by Hemish Ilangaratne to give Hemel a victory by 8 runs and a consolidation of 4th place in the Championship.
