REPORT

A win at last for Hemel 1sts, but only just. Despite the early morning Saturday rain livening up the Heath Park from its recent moribund state Preston elected to bat. Funnily, it was the spin of Parth Mehta who, had been chosen to open the bowling, which proved the most effective as he picked up 4 - 27. Together with a couple of wickets each for Ed Pike (2 - 19) and Mark Brazier (2 - 25) Hemel bowled out Preston for 126 in 39 overs. Hemel were breezing along with Brett Penny hitting 41 from 36 balls and Freddie Lowe scoring 29 (1X4, 3X6s) as they reached 122 - 5.
