Heath Park Cup Final Sponsored by Adex

Hemel Hempstead Town Cricket Club is delighted to be hosting the Heath Park Cup Final sponsored by Adex.

The Heath Park Cup was originally established in 1960 as the Gazette Cup, before it became the Heath Park Cup in 2013, after the Gazette passed on all the administration to HHTCC.

From the outset, Berkhamsted CC have won the competition 11 times, the last time being in 2022 when they beat Leverstock Green in the final. Watford CC have yet to win the cup, although they were runners up to HHTCC in 2015. In their defence, they haven't always entered this competition, preferring the now defunct Watford Observer Cup, which they won 10 times (the last in 2012)

In their Semi Final, Berkhamsted CC beat Redbourn CC by 48 runs. Batting first, Berkhamsted reached 157 all out, thanks to 47 from Daniel Chrispin, 24 from Sam Siraj, 23 from Luke Frey and 22 from Oliver Todd. Redbourn's response never really got going, thanks mainly to 4-17 from Hashmat Jomegol, 2-23 from Sam Siraj and 2-21 from Jamie Shaw and they were all out for 109.

In the other HPC Semi Final, Watford CC beat Hemel Hempstead Town CC by 4 runs in their HPC Semi Final. Watford made 119-7, thanks to a 6th wicket partnership of 49 between Suhaib Ahmed (21) and Gaurav Shinagare (24). Ahmed was in the wickets too, taking 3-23 and Gunjan Hazarika nabbed 4-20, as Hemel were kept to 115-7.

This is the 14th year that Adex have sponsored the Cup. Our thanks go to Directors John Latimer, Kevin Marum and Tony Wood for their ongoing support.
